Assistance for People with Disabilities

We work very hard to accommodate accessibility needs by offering a number of options to help:

- Park in the large section of the Main Parking Lot reserved for those with disabilities. You will need a state-issued parking permit to park in this area. You must then cross the highway where you can board a bus or tram to your destination.
- Enter the grounds using a 45-minute “drop off” pass. These passes are available at the Main Gate automobile entrance, just north of the Main Gate Welcome Center. After passengers are dropped off, the vehicle must be parked in the Main Lot.
- Electric scooters may be rented/registered at the Main Gate Welcome Center. Wheelchairs are also available for rent. Wheelchairs are rented on a first-come basis.
- For further assistance, please visit the Main Gate Welcome Center upon arrival and request the assistance of a supervisor.

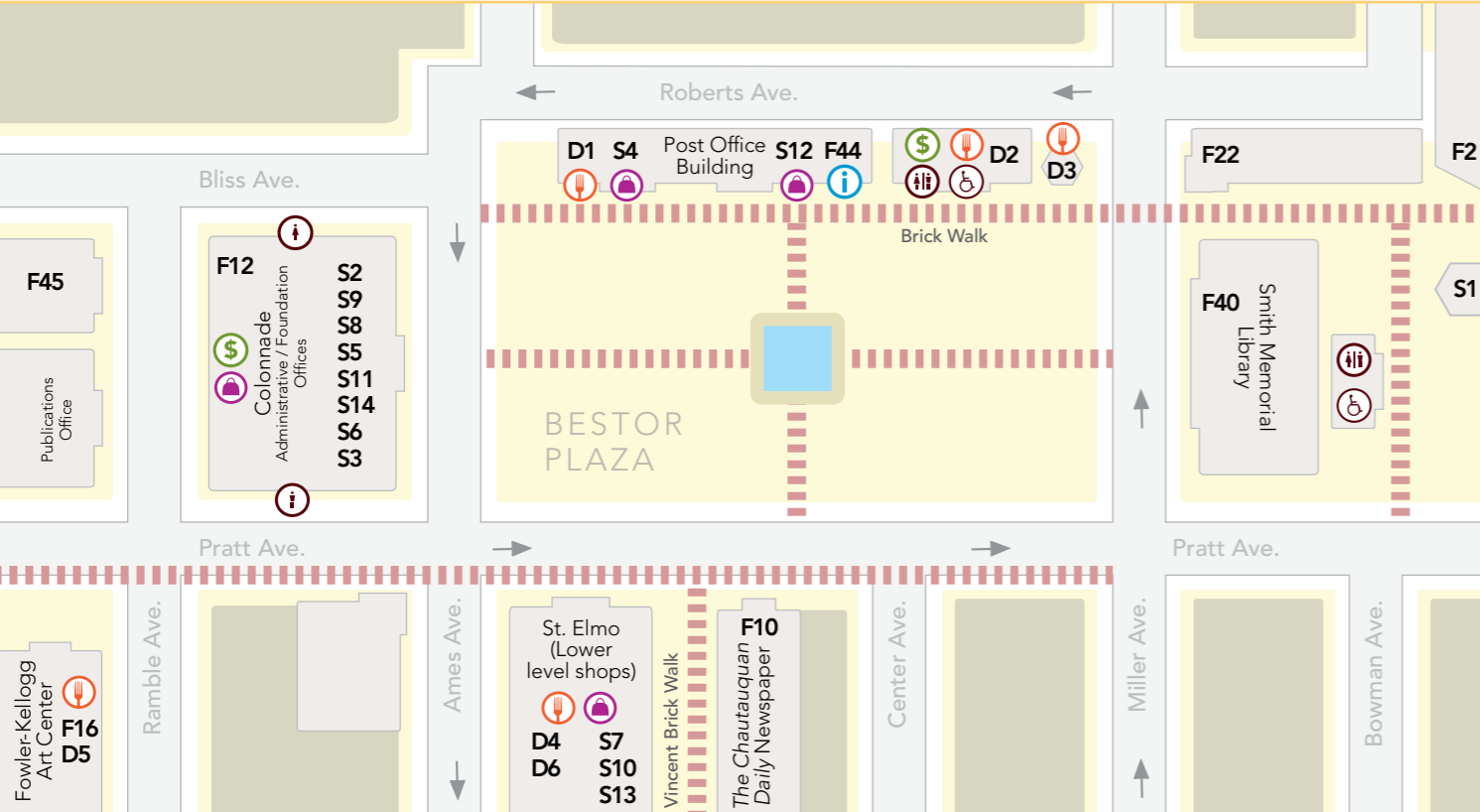

(sizes and locations are approximate)



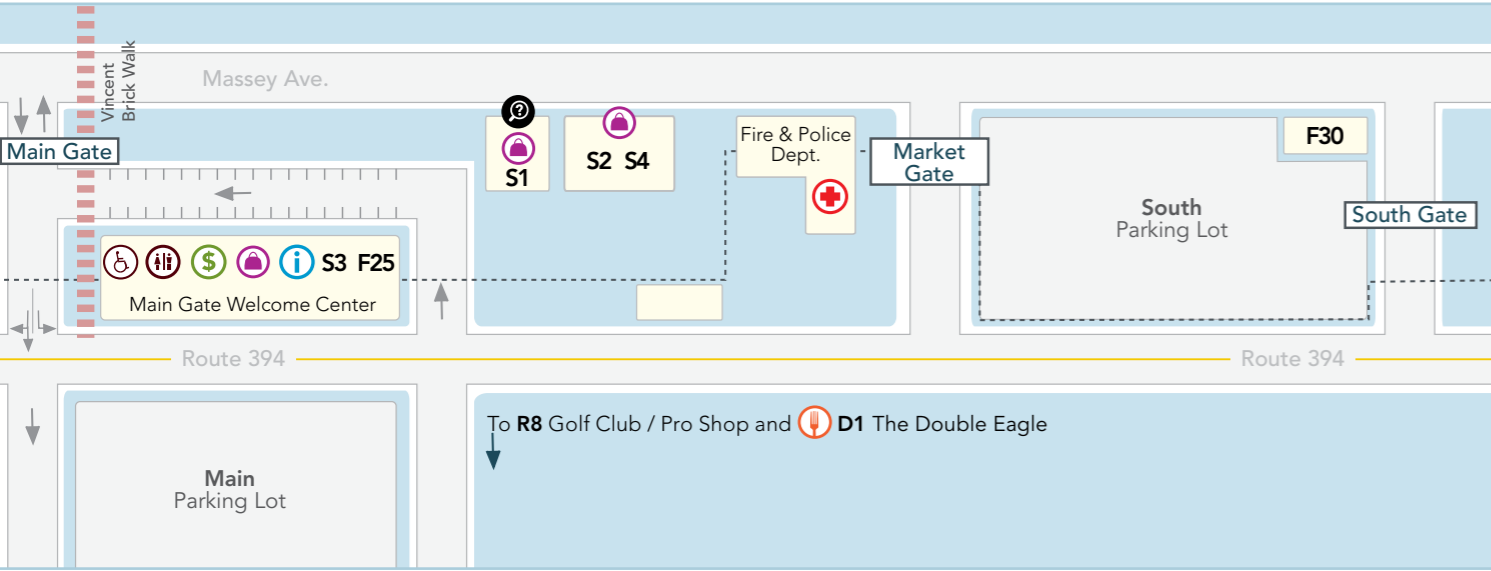

House Numbers: On streets running perpendicular to the lakeside, numbers generally **increase** as you travel toward Route 394 from the lake. On the streets running parallel to the lakeside, **Bestor Plaza** is the center point and numbers generally **increase** as you travel away from it in either direction.
