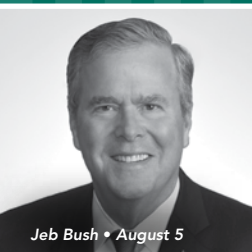

How to Plan Your Visit

This booklet outlines **all long-term ticket options** and information about many other services and tickets. Daily rates can be found online at chq.org/rates.

1. Find Accommodations

Finding accommodations should be your first priority when planning a visit to Chautauqua Institution.

All accommodations within the Institution's grounds are privately owned except for the Athenaeum Hotel.

To explore and secure accommodations, visit accommodations.chq.org

Please ensure that your gate pass dates are the same as your accommodation dates. We encourage you to purchase your gate pass as early as possible to secure the best rate.

2. Order Gate Pass

• Gate Pass

A gate pass is required to enter the grounds and acts as your passport to the Chautauqua Experience. Gate passes include general admission entry to lectures, religious services, popular entertainment and Chautauqua Symphony Orchestra performances in the Amphitheater. The gate pass also includes access to events at the Hall of Philosophy and Elizabeth S. Lenna Hall, art galleries, beaches, parks and complimentary transportation services.

Guests ages 12 and under must be registered to receive a free gate pass. For ages 13 to 25, youth gate passes are available at a reduced rate. Complimentary gate passes are available for active military members (with valid ID) and guests who are age 90 or older by August 30, 2020.

3. Purchases in addition to the gate pass

• Amphitheater Preferred Seating

Secure the best seats in the house for select performances and events. Preferred (assigned) seating is located on the Amphitheater floor.

- Preferred or Preferred Premium section: Closest to stage; seating is assigned and held for the duration of the performance.
- Preferred General section: Seating is unassigned, on a first-come basis and converts to General Admission seating at the start of the performance.

- **Parking Pass**
Required for on-grounds and Main Lot parking.
- **Opera and Theater**
Opera performances in Norton Hall. Theater performances in Bratton Theater.
- **Mooring and Boat Registration Fees**
All boats must be registered. Mooring rentals are available for ramps, buoys and slips.
- **Recreation Activities**
Sign up for golf, tennis or fitness center programs.
- **Special Studies Classes**
Lifelong and enrichment learning with more than 400 classes offered.
- **Youth Programs**
Including preschool, day camp, tennis, sailing, golf and Special Studies classes.

Your gate pass includes General Admission to lectures and performances in the Amphitheater, Hall of Philosophy and Elizabeth S. Lenna Hall. There is no need to purchase an additional ticket for events in these venues, except to secure Preferred seating for selected Amphitheater events. For high-demand Elizabeth S. Lenna Hall events, admission vouchers will be distributed from the Main Gate Ticket Office on the morning of each performance (1 voucher per gate pass).

All season gate passes require a photo.

Prior season gate pass photos will be used when possible. When a photo is not on file or is not usable, the pass will be held at Will Call.

Chautauqua Experience Packets will be mailed to those who make weekly gate pass purchases before June 27.

All gate passes require the holder's full name. Titles and initials may not be used.

If staying in on-grounds accommodations, the address will be required when ordering the gate pass.

Multiple-week discounting is offered when more than one full week of seven consecutive nights is purchased in the same transaction. The weeks do not need to be consecutive. Partial weeks are not eligible for this discount.

Renewals: Must be purchased by March 13 to maintain parking rights.

Reassignment requests: Submit request to ticketoffice@chq.org by March 13. If reassigned, the original parking pass issued must be returned before the reassigned parking pass will be issued. Notification of reassignments begins April 1.

New Requests Waiting List: Submit request to ticketoffice@chq.org, including contact information and property address. Requests are reviewed in the order in which they are received. Notification of assignment begins May 1. Requests submitted after May 1 will be added to the waiting list for the following season.

Chautauqua Institution offers mooring in an assigned space. Vessels moored at an Institution or private dock are required to purchase and display a current registration sticker. The mooring rental period must match the dates on an accompanying gate pass.

- **Mooring Renewals and Reassignments:** Must be purchased by March 13 to reserve the prior season assignment. Reassignment requests are due March 13; send to ticketoffice@chq.org. Notification by docks staff begins June 1.
- **New Mooring:** Only assigned by the Central Dock Office. Starting June 1, contact the office at docks@chq.org or 716-357-6288.

BICYCLES / MOBILITY DEVICES

Privately owned bicycles and mobility devices (scooters) must be registered. There is no charge for registration or the sticker. Registration stickers never expire. Registration can be done when placing your order or upon arrival at the Welcome Center Ticket Office.

Mobility Scooter Rentals:

Chautauqua Institution offers scooter rentals during the season. Scooter rentals are limited and reservations are recommended. Reservations begin June 1 for full-week rentals. A credit card deposit is required; there is a non-refundable deposit for any cancellations of rental reservations. If available, rentals for less than one week are arranged in person on the day of the rental at the Main Gate Welcome Center Information Office.



SPECIAL STUDIES CLASSES

**Class registration begins April 1.
Early registration is recommended.**

Classes in a variety of subjects, for youth and adults, are offered through Chautauqua's Special Studies program. The diverse curriculum includes master classes with Amphitheater speakers, courses through the School of Art, School of Dance and Chautauqua Writers' Center, and more than 400 classes in subjects ranging from history and handcrafts to fitness and the culinary arts.

Early Registration Procedures for Youth Programs

Group size is limited, so early registration is strongly recommended. Many groups routinely reach capacity and late registrations are turned away.

It is required that you include your child's date of birth and the grade your child will be entering in the fall (if school age). This information is needed to place your child in the correct group and to ensure compliance with state-mandated staffing regulations. Registrations without this information will be considered incomplete and will not be processed.

Children's School

Chautauqua Children's School is a developmental preschool for youth ages 3–5. The school operates six classrooms from 9 a.m. to noon Monday to Friday.

Each classroom is staffed with certified teachers, college-age education majors, and high school students. The teachers work as a team and share classroom responsibilities.

Please note that children must be **at least 3 years old** at the time they attend Children's School and **must be** toilet trained.

Group One

Group One is designed for children who will be entering first grade in the fall. This program runs from 9 a.m. to noon and from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, using Children's School and Sheldon Hall of Education facilities in the morning and Boys' and Girls' Club facilities in the afternoon. Group One is intended as a transition between these two programs and includes active play, art activities, swimming/waterfront programs and special events. Children receive an orientation to both facilities during the first morning.

Group One is staffed with certified teachers, qualified college graduates, and college-age and high school-age assistants. The same leaders stay with the children throughout the day. Certified waterfront staff are used for afternoon activities at Club.

Boys' and Girls' Club

Boys' and Girls' Club is a day camp program for youth entering second grade through 10th grade in the fall. Club is in session from 8:30 a.m. until 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Located on the lakefront, Club provides a diverse program that includes field activities, swimming, canoeing, kayaking, sailing, nature, crafts, individual and team sports, music and arts.

Club is a registered day camp and operates under the guidelines and regulations of the New York State Department of Health.

The Boys' and Girls' Club staff includes certified teachers, other college graduates and adult professionals, and college and high school students. The Youth Leadership program provides skill-building and practical experiences and offers educational opportunities through Special Studies to 16-year-olds preparing to become counselors.

Boys' and Girls' Club Plus

Club Plus joins the traditional day camp experience with an interdisciplinary curriculum in the arts and sciences. After spending the morning at Club, campers will participate in age-appropriate afternoon classes and activities that combine STEM education, literary arts and visual arts. Afternoon classes will be led by certified teachers and industry experts. Club Plus capacity is limited; register early.

GATE PASS POLICIES

Terminology

Long-term Gate Pass: Gate pass with minimum length of 24 hours.

Age 12 & Under Gate Pass*: Registration required; no gate pass fee.

Youth Gate Pass*: Age 13 to age 25, based on age when the gate pass begins.

Age 90+ Gate Pass*: Registration required; no gate pass fee. Based on guest's age on Aug. 30, 2020.

Active-duty military*: Registration required; no gate pass fee.

Week: A week is any seven consecutive nights. Weekly gate passes are valid from 7 a.m. on the arrival date until 10 a.m. on departure date. Additional time may be purchased.

*For these passes the proof of eligibility is required when order is placed. Proof of age or proper ID card may be required.

Policies

Use of Gate Pass: A valid gate pass must be presented for scanning on each entrance to and exit from the grounds and into the Amphitheater. If asked, you must be able to produce a valid gate pass while within the grounds of Chautauqua Institution.

The gate pass and its use is governed by the laws of the State of New York including Sections 170.05 and 190.25 of the Penal Law relative to forgery and criminal impersonation. The bearer of this pass agrees to obey all the rules and regulations of Chautauqua Institution. **A pass that is issued to a named individual is non-transferable.** Violation of said rules and regulations will cause forfeiture of all rights granted hereunder.

Commercial Photography: Chautauqua Institution, or its affiliates, may photograph, film, videotape, record or otherwise reproduce the image and/or voice of any person on Chautauqua Institution or Chautauqua Hotel Company property, and use same for any purpose without payment to any person.

Amphitheater Events: Assigned seating areas on the Amphitheater floor will be marked for each event. **Floor seats not marked as assigned** are available to General Admission (GA) ticket/gate pass holders on a first-come basis. Ushers will be available to assist you. **We strongly encourage early arrival for our GA ticket/gate pass holders. Amphitheater gates typically open 60 minutes prior to event start.** Depending on event popularity, a line may form even earlier. Remember that your ticket/gate pass grants early access to the Institution grounds. We invite patrons to take advantage of this added benefit. Before you arrive, please visit our website, chq.org, for information about parking, dining, shopping, programs and other activities covered by this ticket/gate pass.

Processing Fee: There is a processing fee added to each online, phone or paper order. This fee helps defray the cost of operating our ticket office.
