## Cost

For each participant, \$895 includes lodging, breakfast and dinner and a Chautauqua gate pass that provides admission to all Amphitheater programs. Reservations will be confirmed upon receipt of registration and \$100 deposit on a **first-come basis** by mail or email. Once sold out, names will be placed on a waiting list.

The total balance is due on July 1. After July 1, all deposits are non-refundable. We recommend that you consider purchasing third-party trip cancellation insurance.

## Additional Costs

A limited number of single rooms or private baths are available for an additional \$200 per request. Parking in the Main Lot can be paid (\$54) when making final payment.
