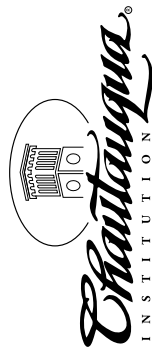

With crowdsourcing, social media campaigns and new distribution channels, films aimed at effecting social and cultural change have found audiences unlike any time in the history of the art form. But how do we measure the impact of such films — from changing minds to changing policy? To close the 2018 season, filmmakers and film lovers gather for a weeklong festival featuring screenings and conversations in venues throughout the grounds, all alongside the Institution's renowned lecture and arts programs. We consider the filmmaker's role and intentions as artist, storyteller, journalist, advocate and activist; the business decisions that influence the distribution and marketing campaigns behind such films; and the effectiveness of films to create empathy — and prompt action — in its audiences.

For each participant, pricing includes lodging, breakfast and dinner and a Chautauqua gate pass that provides admission to all Amphitheater programs. Reservations will be confirmed upon receipt of registration and \$100 deposit on a **first-come basis** by mail or email. Once sold out, names will be placed on a waiting list.

The total balance is due on July 1. After July 1, all deposits are non-refundable. We recommend that you consider purchasing third-party trip cancellation insurance.

Additional Costs

A limited number of single rooms or private baths are available for an additional \$200 per request. Parking in the Main Lot can be paid (\$54) when making final payment. If arriving early Sunday and wish to have parking pass, please purchase a one-week parking pass at the Main Gate Ticket Office for \$54. No need to order one with registration.
