We work very hard to accommodate accessibility needs by offering a number of options to help:

- Enter the grounds using a 45-minute “drop off” pass. These passes are available at the Main Gate automobile entrance, just north of the Main Gate Welcome Center. After passengers are dropped off, the vehicle must be parked in the Main Lot. Gate passes and parking pass must be shown at the gate.
- Park in the large designated section of the Main Lot. You will need a state-issued parking permit to park in this area. You must then cross the highway where you can board a bus or tram to your destination.
- Electric scooters may be rented/registered at the Main Gate Welcome Center. Wheelchairs are also available for rent. All are rented on a first-come basis.
- For further assistance, please visit the Main Gate Welcome Center upon arrival and request the assistance of a supervisor.

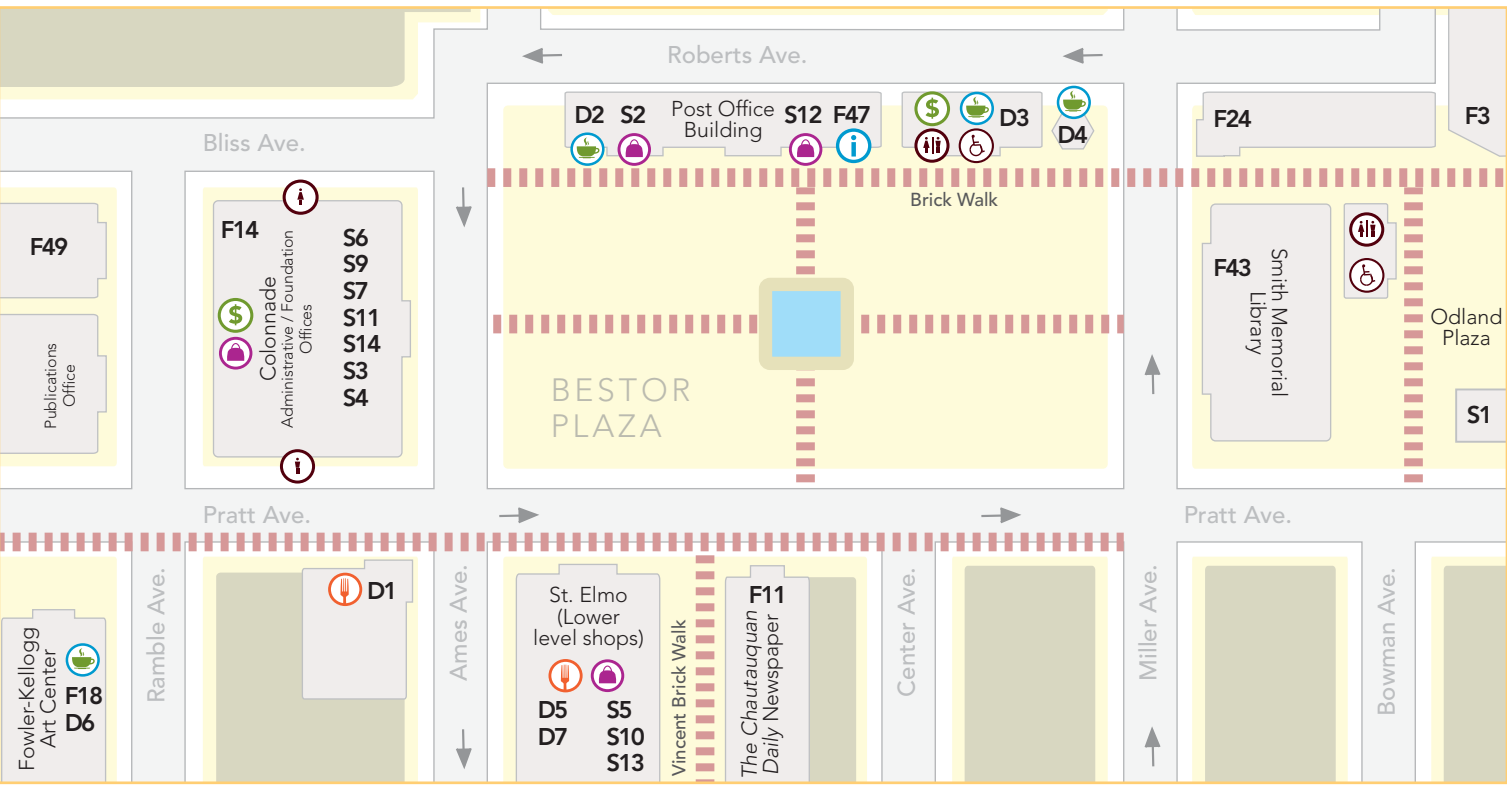

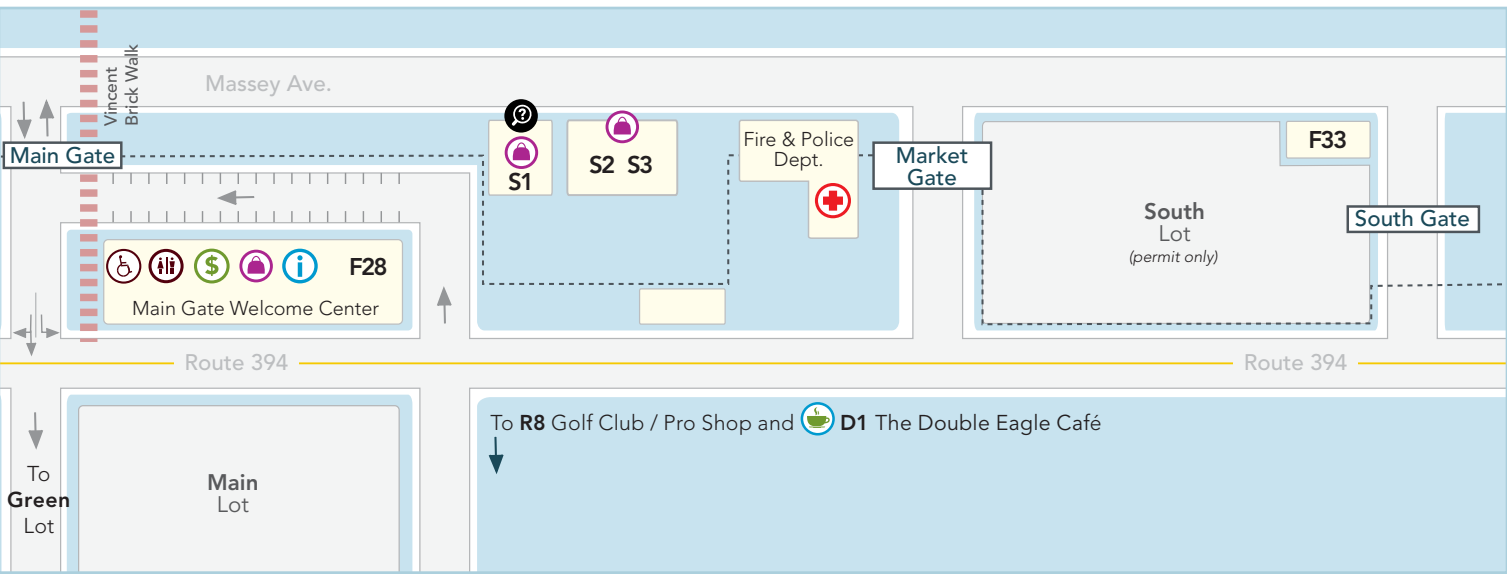
