School Residencies*

Developmental level: PreK-12

Feelin' the Beat integrates social emotional and music learning through drumming. This program is presented in two 10-week residency cycles, where classes receive weekly 30-minute sessions that develop their musical expression and important social skills such as

Young Playwrights Project*

Grades 3-4

This three-phase project brings actors and teaching artists to schools to teach the art of playwriting. This program encourages students to use their imagination and tell their unique stories, centering their creative

Students will engage in hands-on arts and science activities to build their knowledge of the role that each of us play in protecting our water resources.
